2	Scope of Technical Deliverables (Ushuru GPT): The Tender explicitly requests an LLM API service. However, building Ushuru GPT will require several other components, including an agent framework, vector databases, RAG systems, MCP servers, etc. Is the tender limited <i>strictly</i> to the LLM API service, or is there a requirement for the supplier to build and deliver these supplementary architectural components as well?	Tender is limited to only the supply and delivery of the LLM API service.

The scope is limited to the API infrastructure uptime and availability. However, the Open source model hosted by the supplier should be continuously updated whenever new versions are available.
32	Vector Database (RAG) Architecture: Is KRA providing a pre-indexed Knowledge Base, or is the service provider responsible for the "Ingestion Pipeline" (extracting, chunking, and embedding) of the thousands of pages of tax circulars and laws?	RAG implementation will be handled internally by KRA.
33	Security & PII Masking: Since the solution may involve taxpayers interacting with sensitive records, does KRA have a preferred tool for Data Anonymization/Masking to ensure compliance with the Data Protection Act?	Current scope for interaction with the LLM API service is publicly available information only.
34	On Page 37, the document states the AI is to assist in retrieving "publicly available information". However, on Page 38, the technical requirements explicitly mention "internal/private data sent to the model". This is a slight contradiction that affects our risk assessment. Can KRA clarify if the knowledge base is strictly public info (tax laws/circulars) or if the system will process sensitive taxpayer PII?	Internal private data sent to the model refers to content that is sent by the users when interacting with the model. i.e. any information that is sent as part of the prompts/questions. The knowledge base for building responses is strictly publicly available information.
34	Is the scope only public info, meaning we won't need complex PII masking or 100% local residency. Or does it involve private data, so that we stick to the high-security "Local Gateway" or "Sovereign AI" approach?	The current scope is publicly available information only.
35	Vendor Evaluation Criteria	Bidders are notified that Vendor Evaluation Criteria has been introduced under this Addendum and is marked as "A – Vendor Evaluation"
